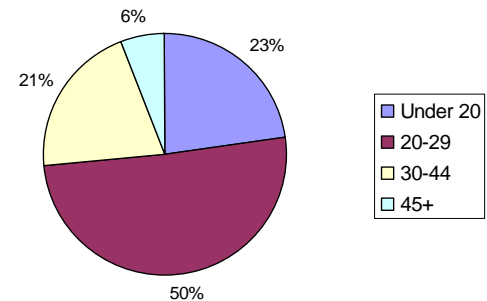

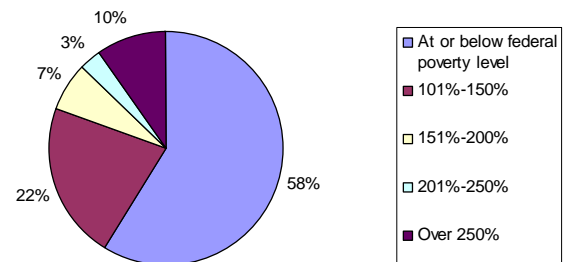
In 2007, Missouri's Title X clinics performed:
